# WHAT ITEMS CAN BE COLLECTED?

- ✓ Air conditioners
- Bikes and toys
- Blinds and window coverings
- Car seats (cut straps) or recycle through RAA
- Dismantled clothes lines
- 🗸 Furniture
- Hot water services
- Lawn mowers
- Mattresses (must book separately for recycling)
- 🗸 Rainwater tanks
- Refrigerators and freezers (remove doors for safety)
- Sheets of iron and guttering (up to 2m)
- ✓ Small items of scrap metal
- Timber off cuts (up to 2m)
- Washing machines and dryers
- Wooden pallets (non-refundable/returnable)

**Maximum of 2m<sup>3</sup>** (2m x 1m x 1m)/a 6x4 trailer load will be collected. Place items on kerbside by 6am on your collection day but no earlier than 24 hours beforehand.

**Excess or unacceptable items will not be collected** and must be removed within 24 hours of collection by the resident. Illegal dumping fines may apply for non-compliance.

# WHAT ITEMS CAN'T BE COLLECTED?

- Ammunition, explosives or flares (contact the Police 131 444)
- 🗡 Batteries

- Bricks, rocks, dirt, pavers, concrete and building materials
- X Business or industrial waste
- X Car tyres or car parts
- X Carpet or floor coverings (book with Recycle360)
- Co-mingled recycling, general waste, food and garden organics
- X Fire extinguishers
- 🗡 Gas bottles
- X Glass panels or windows
- Hazardous materials (e.g. asbestos, chemicals, batteries, liquids, motor oils and paints)
- X Items too heavy for two people to lift
- X Material with protruding nails and screws (please remove or bend over)
- X PVC pipe

E-Waste – e.g. TVs, computers and anything with a battery or cord – can be dropped at locations listed on East Waste's website. Visit **eastwaste.com.au** and click on "Electronic Recycling".

## WHY WASTE IT? WHEN YOU CAN... AVOID RE-USE COMPOST REDUCE RECYCLE

### TIPS TO REDUCE HARD WASTE:

### AVOID REDUCE

### **Avoid or Reduce:**

Purchasing low quality, non-durable items as these may break and need to be disposed of more readily.

### RE-USE

### **Choose to Re-Use:**

**Old Furniture:** Refurbish and repurpose into new masterpieces for yourself, to sell or donate them to charity.

Whitegoods and homewares: Second hand items can be purchased for a fraction of the cost of a brand new item.

Sell, Swap, Share or Donate: Durable, good quality items can be used again by others. There are several websites promoting the re-use of items through resale, swapping, sharing and donating.

Search for: 'Buy, swap and sell' on Facebook.

**Donate to Charity:** eg. Salvage and Save, Salvos, Lions Clubs, Rotary Groups, Vinnies or RSPCA.



**Garage Sale:** Garage sales are a great way to sell and buy second hand goods.



**Repair and Restore:** If it's broken, why not fix it? There are great 'how to' videos and manuals online. If you haven't got time to do it yourself, take it to a repair shop, repair cafe or get a handyman to help. This will also save you the cost of buying a new item to replace it.



**Recycle:** Take your unwanted items to a recycling centre. E.g. Electronic waste items.
