S 54 – Casual Vacancies - NEW

 Inserts a clause that references the disqualification of a member by an Order of South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (SACAT) (in addition to a court order) as a grounds for a casual vacancy.



S 55A– Leave of Absence – council member contesting election – NEW

- Leave is automatically granted.
- Not entitled to any allowance whilst on leave.
- Must not use any facility, service or other support provided by the council to its members
- Must not carry out any Member function or duty \$15,000 maximum penalty





S 55A – Quorum


 Council members suspended from office or those granted leave are not counted to calculate a quorum.

S 58– Role of Principal Member

Business as usual PLUS:

- Provide leadership and guidance to members,
- lead the promotion of positive and constructive working relationships
- Support members to understand the separation of responsibilities
- Guidance to members on their performance

Analysis = Training for Principal Member TBC



S 59– Role of Members

Business as usual PLUS:

- Act with integrity
- Ensure positive and constructive relationships
- Recognise and support the role of the principal member and the function of council as a whole
- Participate in deliberations & activities of council

Analysis = Training for Members TBC



S 76 - Allowances

- Requires the Renumeration Tribunal SA (RTSA) to have regard to the *'ratio of members to ratepayers'* when determining allowances.
- Deletes reference to a 'scheme prescribed by regulations'.
- Allows LGA to recover costs from councils as incurred by the RTSA in making a determination.



S 78A – Legal Advice

• Repeal of the entire section as Council's facilitated legal advice via Policy in the absence of Regulation.



S 90A - Information or Briefing Sessions – NEW (kind of)

Requires that the; **place**, **date**, **time**, **topic** and whether the meeting was **open to the public** be published as soon as practicable after holding the Information or Briefing session.





S 90(3)(O) – Meeting in Confidence - NEW


• Provision for 'proposed Award Recipients' before the presentation of the Award.



S 99A – Remuneration of CEO - NEW

Requires Council's to remunerate their CEO within the salary bands as determined by the RTSA.

- clarifies that the obligation will <u>not apply</u> until the RTSA has made its final determination.
- Councils will NOT need to comply with this requirement for new or reappointing CEO's until the first determination by the RTSA is made.

- R12 Motions 7 Days notice Monday before



Equal Opportunity Act – Commencing 20 September

S 87 (6e) Sexual Harassment - NEW

 The change now makes it unlawful for a Member to subject another Member to sexual harassment.

LG (Elections) Act – Commencing 20 September

S 48 (1a) Method of counting and provisional declarations

This change provides a counting method to be used to fill one (1) vacancy where;

 NO candidate receives a number of votes equal to or greater than the quota OR where two or more candidates have an equal number of votes in a general election.





LG (Elections) Regs – Commencing 20 September

R4 – the regulations will require;

Candidate profiles submitted when nominating for Local Government Elections must include;

- A statement that identifies if they live in the area or ward they have nominated
- Membership of a political party
- Name of political party, dates joined or ceased to be a member.





LG (Elections) Regs – Commencing 20 September

R5 – S57(3) of the Act;

- Providing food, drink or entertainment is below a prescribed level of 'bribery'.
- \$20 prescribed level (bribery)
 \$2,500 prescribed level (large gifts)

Comply with the council's community engagement policy adopted under section 50A of the Act.
