Enriching their senses:



### Sight

    - Crinkly.
  - o Rigid.
- Grooming session.
- Attach a broom head to a pole so the dog can rub against it.

### Smell

- For dogs, the sense of smell is their favourite, because it's their strongest.
- They don't have to enjoy every single scent, just experience it.
- Introduce different scents in your dog's environment.
- Place various scents on cotton swabs in jars with vented lids.
- Use essential oils, spices, flowers, etc.
- Rub cloths over different animals, place them in boxes allowing your dog to smell and investigate.
- Spray deodorants, perfumes around the backyard.
- Smear food around the back yard for the dog to find and lick.

- Allow dogs to smell when out on a walk.
