

- Following the November storm event in Q2, priority has been given to the backlog of operational requests that Council received before the time of the storm event, as resources were diverted to clean up storm-related damages.
- As a result of this, the average response times for Q3 increased **183%** from the average timeframe of 5.2 days taken to assess customer requests for city operational works.








Muggs Hill Road works have been awarded and construction commenced in Q3 2022/23 FY.




CAPITAL WORKS Completed Work In Progress

Road Seal/ Kerb Program



- Wheaton Road (Price Street to Corunna Avenue), Swift Avenue (Price Avenue to cul-de-sac end) and Highfield Drive (Grand Boulevard to Kaufman Place) are to be sealed in Q4 2022/23 FY.
- The works are to incorporate pavement stabilisation (Highfield Drive only), pavement reinforcement (Ha Telit Asphalt Reinforcement Grid) and a crumb rubber seal.

Traffic Control Device New Construction



- The LED changeover is scheduled for completion in Q4 2022/23 FY. Further work to be undertaken to finalise the changeover of the decorative pedestrian (P) category street lights. These works are scheduled for completion in Q2 2023/24 FY.
- West Parkway school crossing construction is scheduled for completion in Q4 2023/24 FY
- Princes Road Pedestrian Refuge Treatment investigations and detailed design have been completed - Construction works to be coordinated with road reseal works and completed in Q2 2023/24 FY.
- Traffic calming device installation along Trevor Terrace (Alison Road to Cassia Street) and Sturt Avenue (Main Road to Myrtle Road) are scheduled for completion in Q4 2022/23 FY.
- Laffers Road Belair Primary School drop off/ pick up and car parking concept designs are to be developed in Q1 2023/24.

Main Road/ Monalta Drive – Belair Primary School intersection treatment concept designs were completed and community engagement undertaken in Q3 2022/23 FY. Preliminary drawings and considering community feedback, are to be completed in Q4 2022/23 FY. Department for Infrastructure and Transport approval required prior to commence of construction works.



Vaccines administered at Community and School Clinics

10 school clinics and 10 community clinics

- With vaccinations for Year 7 and 8 students having commenced for the 2023 calendar year during Q3, Council's immunisation service was highly active in Q3 with a 64% increase from the historical average of 1,913 vaccines administered per quarter.
- In Q3 our immunisation service administered 3,140 vaccines to a total of 1,612 clients For comparison, Q2 was notably quiet for Council's immunisation service as of the school holidays and end of year break with only 642 vaccines administered at this time.

HIGHLIGHT

The establishment of Tiwu Kumangka (formerly The Blackwood Community Hub) is moving steadily towards completion. Major construction components of the structure have been installed with further elements set to be installed soon.

This quarter, the hub was given the name Tiwu Kumangka, after being endorsed by Council at its February meeting, following an extensive consultation with Kaurna representatives and the community. City of Mitcham Mayor Dr Heather Holmes Ross said the name incorporated the word 'Kumangka' (coming together) and 'Tiwu' (yellow-tailed black cockatoo) to represent the return of the vulnerable cockatoo.

The project aims to provide a community facility that will create a precinct that offers recreational, social, educational and lifelong learning opportunities, supported by the proposed Waite Street Reserve upgrade.

Tiwu Kumangka is on track to be open to the community by August/ September 2023.

Average number of days taken to complete urgent tree defects after assessment

- Following the November storm event in Q2, priority has been given to the backlog of urgent tree defects that were highlighted before the time of the storm event, as resources were diverted to clean up storm-related damages.
- As a result, the average response time to complete urgent tree defects has increased **181%** from the average of 5.8 days in order to make progress with the backlog of defects.

Average number of days taken to assess Customer Requests relating to tree works (pruning/ removal)

- The November storm event in Q2 has resulted in priority being given to the backlog of tree maintenance assessments that were received by Council before the time of the storm event.
- With this, the average number of days to assess tree maintenance requests has increased **129.2%** from the average of 9.6 days to complete these assessments.



INNOVATION

Council partnered with a student from the University of South Australia, who completed a PHD on the usage of the Tensar Geogrid at Naomi Terrace, and is going to be presenting at the Australian and New Zealand Conference on Geomechanics in Cairns.

Tensar Geogrid is a form of geosynthetic materials, made up of plastic polymers that are assembled in a grid-like formation. It is used to reinforce soil, providing stability in construction projects such as roads, retaining walls and embankments.

The geogrid works by interlocking with surrounding soil to create a stronger composite that is resistant to movement and deformation. Tensar Grid ultimately extends the lifespan of structures by preventing soil erosion and improving load distribution upon a structure.


