

What is a By-Law

- By-Laws are local laws made by Council to manage, control and regulate activities & local issues on public land
- The Local Government Acts empower local government to make local laws (By-laws)



What is a By-Law

- They provide Council with the power to respond to community needs and address any local issues within its area
- Introduced to protect public health, community safety, and amenity in the local area



By-Law Process

- Council is required to follow Section 251 of the Local Government Act 1999
- By-Laws are required to review their By-Laws every 7 years
- The Current By-Laws expire on 1 January 2023

Proposed Draft By-Laws

BY-LAW NO.1 – PERMITS AND PENALTIES

A By-Law to regulate permits and penalties issued by Council



Proposed Draft By-Laws



BY-LAW NO.2 – MOVEABLE SIGNS

A By-Law to set standards for moveable signs on roads and to provide conditions for the placement of signs.



Proposed Draft By-Laws

BY-LAW NO.3 – LOCAL GOVERNMENT LAND

A By-Law to regulate activities, access to, and use of Local Government Land (other than roads) and certain public places



Proposed Draft By-Laws

BY-LAW NO.4 – ROADS


A By-Law to regulate or prohibit certain activities on roads in the Council area



Proposed Draft By-Laws

BY-LAW NO.5 – DOGS

A By-Law to limit the number of dogs kept on premises and for the management and control of dogs in the Council area





Proposed Draft By-Laws

BY-LAW NO.6 - CATS

A By-Law to limit the number of cats kept on premises and for the management and control of cats in the Council area;

Dog & Cat Management Plan 2018-2023

 Community Feedback supporting a level of cat confinement



 Objective 6.3.4 of the plan is to consider cat confinement

Proposed Draft By-Laws

BY-LAW NO.7 – WASTE MANAGEMENT

A By-Law to regulate the management of waste, recycling and green organic bins and removal of waste from premises





Proposed Timeframe

- Memo to Elected Members with tonight's presentation
- Feedback to Mark Austin by Wednesday 10 December
 2021
- Draft By-Laws prepared
- Report provided to Council meeting February with draft By-Laws
- Endorsed to go to public consultation
- Dog & Cat By-Laws are then referred to DCMB for comment
- By-Laws are put out to Public Consultation at least 21 days



Proposed Timeframe

- Any changes determined from public consultation are incorporated
- Final By-Laws considered and endorsed at the Council Meeting in April/May 2022
- By-Laws sent to the Legislative Review Committee for scrutiny
- By-Laws published in the Government Gazette by 26 May
 2022 (they will come into operation 4 months following this)
- It is proposed that the By-Laws will then come into effect on 30 September (subject to Legislative Review Committee Scrutiny)
