### Timeline of Events

**2019** - Approach to City of Mitcham from Office of Sport, Recreation and Racing (OSRR) for interest in operating site

**March 2020 -** OSR RFI issued and interest indicated by Council (subject to further info)

**January 2021 -** Further approach from OSRR to discuss possibility of City of Mitcham taking management and maintenance of the site

**April 2021** - Site visit Council & OSRR

April/May 2021 - Preliminary investigations by Council


June 2021 - EM Update




## The Opportunity

The OSRR are seeking Proposal from Council:

- Manage and maintain the site, for a period of time (to be agreed)
- Including managing the current site users and potential new users
- Have indicated a preference to work with Council





- OSRR received a \$9m grant to redevelop the site
- Current development being undertaken includes:
  - A new clubroom for 120 people
    - 4 changerooms
    - New bar
- New LED lights on all ovals
- New irrigation system on 2 ovals

# Site Usage Principles

- Department of Sport and Recreation came to own the site from the Minister of Environment and Planning in 1991
- Understood to be political/historical demands on usage for Women's Sport, rather than legal
  - Staff understanding through discussions with OSRR womens sport use favoured and desirable, although flexible

- 4 topographical levels
- 3 large ovals
- 3 site compounds/car parks
- Department of Environment own land to the east
- Unused tennis courts
- Unused area (Level 4)



## The Site: Redevelopment (cont.)

#### L. Large Oval 1: Helen Black Oval

- a. Size: 15,468 sq m
- b. Currently used for Cricket (summer) and Lacrosse (winter)
- c. Will be upgraded with new 100 Lux LED lights as part of OSRR upgrade
- d. Not getting new irrigation system- needs repair

# The Site: Redevelopment (cont.)

#### 2. Large Oval 2: ISAS Oval

- a. Size: 11,438 sq m
- b. Currently used for Lacrosse (winter)
- c. Will be upgraded with new 350 Lux LED lights as part of OSRR upgrade
- d. Will have new irrigation/drainage system and turf- re levelled

## The Site: Redevelopment (cont.)

#### 3. Large Oval 3: Gordon Brown Oval

- a. Size: 18,336 sq m
- b. Currently used for soccer (winter)
- c. Will be separated into 3 soccer pitches (unequal size) as part of redevelopment.
- d. Will be upgraded with new 200 Lux LED lights (match day) and 100 LUX lights (training) as part of OSRR upgrade
- e. Will have new irrigation system
- f. Lighting will be upgraded to the main pitch 200 lux and comply with Football South Australia guidelines. Remaining space will be training area lit to 100 lux.
- g. Will have 2 new change rooms, kiosk, first aid space, storage to service Gordon Brown.

## The Site: Natural Environment

- The ovals and building sites within the WMPF are surrounded by a mixture of native vegetation, trees and weed species.
- An estimated 27,000 sq m is covered by vegetation (25% of the site area).



# The Opportunity: Financial Analysis

#### Estimated:

- \$200k annual operating costs:
  - Water
  - Mowing
  - Irrigation maintenance
  - Oval prep
  - Tree and Weed management
    - \$100k once off establishment costs
      - Drainage
      - Weed removal
      - Once off plantings



# City of Mitcham current state

- Manson(1 club plus SACA)
- Mortlock (2 clubs )
- Price Memorial Oval (2 clubs)
- St Marys (2 clubs)
- WA Norman (2 clubs)

#### Total of 18 Clubs

- On top of these sporting club arrangements we also have many Schools who use these Ovals,
- Across these 11 Sports Ovals we have approximately 61 leases and licences operating



# City of Mitcham: Site Concerns

- Preference should be given to potential site users from within the City of Mitcham
- No on site infrastructure for sports other than lacrosse, soccer and cricket
- More availability in Summer than Winter
- Pitches only suitable for Junior Cricket
- **Resourcing** stakeholder relationships, maintenance, lease/licence negotiations, management of facility
- Requirement of women's sport percentage unconfirmed
  - Potential difficulties with relocation of Clubs
