WHO IS THE CITY OF MITCHAM?

The City of Mitcham is a **local government** in South Australia.



We are in the **southern part of Adelaide**.



We have a mayor who leads us with 13 Councillors who represent our community and make decisions



Elected Members are people that are **chosen by the community.**

Our staff help to look after:

- Footpaths, roads, bridges

WHO IS THE CITY OF MITCHAM?

There are **20,000** people who live in the City of Mitcham who need help with access and inclusion.



This includes people with disability, young families who use prams, and people older than 65.

2. Raise awareness about the rights of people with disability

Rights means the things that you can access such as going to school, seeing a doctor, playing sport.

Talk to people with disability to find out what they want



Work together with other disability groups

Talk to people with disability with different backgrounds about what we can do to make things better



Help people with disability so they can share their thoughts with us



Make sure people with disability can access and use all of our documents in printed format and on our website



Make sure people with disability can come to our events and join in our programs and activities



Our plan has **five** important focuses:



Make accessible spaces

Accessible means that people can go to and use a place with no difficulty

We will:

Give our staff training on how to create accessible spaces



Make sure people with disability can access our outside spaces



Check our buildings, paths, parks and/or playgrounds and carparks to see if we need to fix anything



Our plan has **five** important focuses:

Ensure people with disability can work and volunteer with us.

Volunteer means learning and experiencing work without being paid

Make volunteer opportunities for people with disability



Remove any barriers that make it difficult for people with disability to work at the City of Mitcham
