### OUR CUSTOMERS

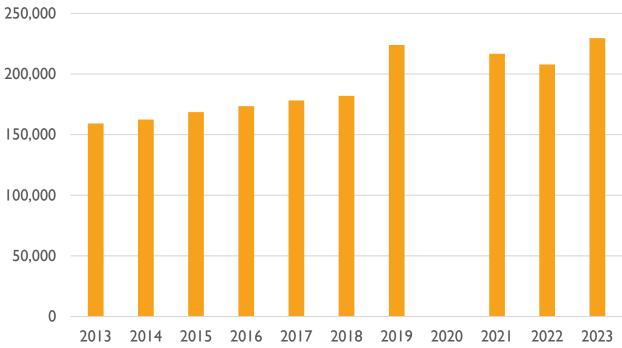


#### Our customers come from far and wide......

Our programs cater for a wide range of ages and abilities from Kindergym for babies through to Strength for Life fitness classes catering to the over 50's (our oldest client is 93).



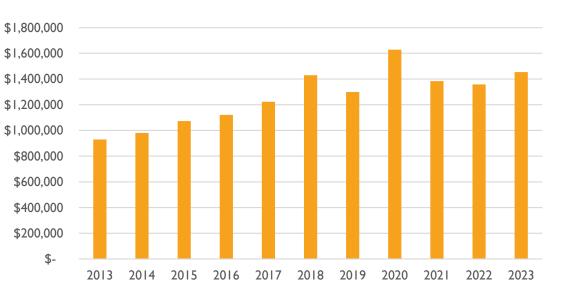

### Annual Visitations







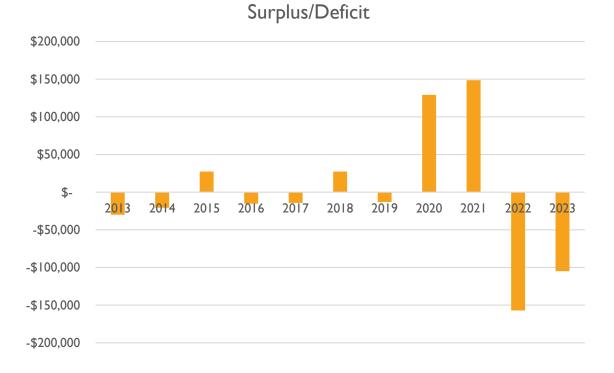

## COVID IMPACT

#### 2020 & 2021

With the introduction of COVID 19, government based support helped us get through this tough time.

- Job Keeper & other various COVID Support Scheme
- Lead to roughly \$670,000 of our income for that year

#### 2022 & 2023

Once the support stopped, we *continued* to make allowances to our patrons in terms of our fee structure:

- No cancellation fees (All programs)
- Reduced forfeit fees
- More allowance for holds on memberships





### WHERE TO FROM HERE?



Our plans to improve our future finances:

- 5 Year Budget Plan\*
- Overall price increase of 7% to all our programs in 2024. One of our biggest overall price increases in over 10 years.
- Month to Month reporting & statistics gathering to help us deal with cashflow/income issues as they arise.
- Strengthen relationships with State Government.
