About Mitcham

The City of Mitcham is one of the oldest councils in South Australia, comprising towns and suburbs settled by Europeans from as early as 1837. This picturesque City is located in the foothills approximately six kilometres south of Adelaide. The City has an enviable blend of both urban and semi-rural areas and is renowned for its avenues of street trees, its beautiful parks, reserves and gardens, its historic homes, unique historical areas and its magnificent views from the hills over the City and to the coast.

The City is well served by many tourist attractions including Carrick Hill Estate, Belair National Park, Brownhill Creek Reserve, Waite Arboretum, Wittunga Botanic Garden, Sturt River Linear Trail, Colebrook Reconciliation Park, reserves and numerous trails through the historic Mitcham Precinct, Blackwood, Brownhill Creek, Colonel Light Gardens, Lower Mitcham and St Marys.

The diversity of the Mitcham area is unique with our suburbs including State Heritage listed Colonel Light Gardens part of the original Thousand Home Scheme and Australia's most complete example of an early 1900s garden suburb; historic Belair, a unique suburb surrounded on three sides by parks including South Australia's oldest park Belair National Park; Springfield, one of Adelaide's most prestigious suburbs with sweeping views over the Adelaide plans; Bedford Park and St Marys, adjacent to Flinders University and home to many new Mitcham residents and students from overseas as well as a new housing development at Craigburn Farm.

Ward Map


This map shows the wards and suburbs in the City of Mitcham. The Councillors for each ward are listed on the following pages and welcome your comments and feedback about your ward area.

Council Elections

Local Government elections are held every four years and supplementary elections are held when a vacancy occurs in council. If you are registered on the State electoral roll you will automatically receive a voting pack. If you are not registered on the State electoral roll you can register on Council's supplementary roll. This is important because if you are not an Australian citizen, and not on the State electoral roll, but registered on our supplementary roll, you can vote in a City of Mitcham election if you are 18 years or older and have lived in the City of Mitcham for more than one month. Landlords, businesses and bodies corporates located in the City of Mitcham that own or occupy rateable properties can also register to vote in council elections by being on the supplementary roll. Waste Collection and Recycling

The City of Mitcham provides a three-bin service to dispose of your household waste and recycling at your property.

The three bins are:

- Waste to landfill (blue lid)
- Recycling (yellow lid)
- Green organics (green lid)

Council provides residents with the recycling and waste to landfill bin at no cost. To use the green organics service, residents need to provide their own 240L green lidded bin.

The waste to landfill bin is collected weekly and the recycling and green organics bins fortnightly on alternate weeks.

Bins should be put on the kerbside outside the front of your property before 6am on the day they are to be collected. Bins must be placed on the kerbside with the lid opening towards the road, a small distance apart from each other – the lid should be closed.

Food Scraps Recycling

Food scraps, paper towel, tissues and pizza boxes can all go into your green organics bin for composting. You can place your food scraps into your green organics bin loose, wrapped in newspaper or use a kitchen caddy and compostable bags. Kitchen caddies and compostable bags are available from the City of Mitcham Civic Centre, 131 Belair Road, Torrens Park and the Blackwood Library, 215 Main Road, Blackwood. Missed Collections and other Issues?

For missed or damaged waste to landfill (blue lid) bins call Council on 1300 133 466.

For missed or damaged recycling (yellow lid) or green organics (green lid) bins call East Waste on 8347 5111.

Hard Waste Collection

Each household can book one free hard waste collection of up to two cubic metres of material per financial year.

This can include white goods such as fridges and washing machines, furniture, timber off cuts, etc.

It is illegal to put hard waste on the verge without booking a collection.

Lynton Green Organics Drop Off Facility

Excess green organics can be taken to the Lynton Green Organics Drop Off Facility. The facility is open 9am-3pm on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Saturday of each month (excluding public holidays) as well as on select Mondays throughout the bushfire season. 
Recycling Electrical Waste

E-waste is any electrical or electronic item that use a power plug or battery to run. All e-waste such as televisions, computers, home appliances are banned from landfill as they contain many recyclable materials.

For safe disposal take your e-waste to an Unplug N'Drop location at:

- City of Mitcham Civic Centre, 131 Belair Road, Torrens Park, available 24/7
- City of Mitcham Operations Depot, 5 Winston Court, Melrose Park, available Monday to Friday 7am to 4pm (excluding public holidays).

Support for Older People

We provide a range of subsidised services to support older and vulnerable residents so they can continue to live independently in their homes and participate actively in the community for as long as possible.

Immunisation

We provide free immunisation services to help protect the community from certain diseases.

Our immunisation clinics are held at two locations:

• Blackwood Church of Christ, 367 Shepherds Hill Road, Blackwood on the first Wednesday of the month from 5.30pm to 6.30pm and third Wednesday of the month from 11.30am to 12.30pm.

Dogs and Cats

All dogs and cats three months or older must be registered with the City of Mitcham within 14 days of ownership and registered each year on 1 July.

It is important to register your dog and cat so if it becomes lost, we can contact you to reunite you with your pet.

It is a requirement under the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995 that all dogs and cats are microchipped. All dogs and cats born from 1 July 2018 are also required to be desexed unless the owner is registered as a breeder.
